

St. Thérèse of Lisieux was born in 1873 in Alençon, France and became one of the Church's most beloved saints. Through her autobiography *The Story of a Soul*, she has touched millions of hearts. Canonized in 1925 and named a Doctor of the Church in 1997, her teachings remain deeply relevant today.

Discover the gentle wisdom of St. Thérèse of Lisieux, the "Little Flower" of Carmel, whose Little Way offers an accessible path to holiness—one of trust, love, humility, simplicity and finding God in the ups and downs of everyday life.

In a world obsessed with achievement and perfection, Thérèse reminds us:


- You are precious to God, even in your weakness.

St. Teresa of Avila was born in 1515 in Spain and was a woman of deep prayer and unwavering service to God. Her work of renewal would lead eventually to a new Order within the Carmelite family, the Discalced Carmelites. She was canonized in 1622 and declared a Doctor of the Church in 1970.

St. Teresa's spiritual classics - including *The Interior Castle, The Way of Perfection, and The Book of Her Life* - continue to guide us in seeking God within, growing in grace, and living lives rooted in love.

St. Titus Brandsma was a Carmelite Friar born in 1881, in the Netherlands who exemplified extraordinary courage during WWII. As a Catholic Journalist he opposed Nazi oppression and displayed deep compassion and forgiveness to those who persecuted him. His profound understanding of Christ's suffering led him to embrace his own sacrifice, which resulted in his Martyrdom on July 26th, 1942, in Dachau Concentration Camp.

## What we can learn from St. Titus Brandsma:

### Speak the Truth with Courage

Titus reminds us that standing up for what is right, especially when it's dangerous, is a powerful act of faith. He used his voice as a journalist and teacher to oppose lies and defend human dignity.

### • Find Strength in Prayer

His Carmelite spirituality rooted him in silence and contemplation. The "cell" of solitude became his sanctuary, where he met God and found the courage to face immense suffering.

#### Love Without Limits

Even in the face of hatred and cruelty, Titus chose compassion and forgiveness. He challenges us to see Christ in everyone, even our enemies.
